

Clarke Creek Wind Farm Overview



- Expected project size is:
 - Up to 195 turbines with output of approximately 800MW;
 - 400MW solar; and
 - battery storage.
- Total project investment ~\$1.5 billion.
- 1st Stage of the project:
 - 100 Goldwind turbines totaling 450MW
 - 346.5MW section supplying Stanwell Corporation under Power Purchase Agreement
- Working to prepare the project for construction.
- Aim to start early construction works, followed by full wind farm construction, in early 2022.
- Estimated 350 jobs during construction period and 25 full time jobs during operations (25 years).



COVID-19 Update

- Goldwind Australia continues to follow core principles in our response to CV-19:
 - Protect the safety and welfare of our staff, contractors and the communities in which we operate, particularly those in high risk categories.
 - Maintain productivity to meet business objectives and ensure continuity of businesscritical activities within Federal and State Government directives.
 - Support and boost existing and new economic activity, particularly within regional communities close to our projects.
- Measures include:
 - Interstate and intrastate in line with state restrictions.
 - Attendance at public and community events where they are happening.
 - Office based staff in Melbourne and Sydney are have a phased approach to returning to the office, most staff back in 2022.
 - Close monitoring of changing requirements.


Project Activities - Recent

- The equity process is complex and ongoing but we are progressing well.
- Goldwind will continue to be involved through a significant contribution towards construction, delivery and supply of turbines, and operation and maintenance of the wind farm.
- Grid connection technical planning and agreements progressing.
- Offsite road works and upgrades working closely with DTMR and local councils to finalise documents.
 - DTMR has approved the work packages for site entrances, passing bays, and Marlborough-Sarina Road widening works.
 - Ports Application for modification works within Gladstone Ports is underway.
 - Collaboration with QPS, TMR, Gladstone Regional Council and Gladstone Port to optimise OSOM TMP.
- Successful Industry Briefing Events hosted by the Department of State Development, Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning with presentations from Catcon and Yurika.
- Preparing various plans, secondary approvals and documents necessary before start of construction.
 - IRC has approved temporary concrete batching works and currently assessing the Operational Works (excavating and filling).
 - LSC has approved the Operational Works (excavating and filling) and currently assessing the application for temporary concrete batching (notification signs currently up and newspaper notification published 9th Oct in CQ Today).
